1. General Digital Safety Alert (Newsletter or Email)

Subject: Digital Safety Starts at Home - What Parents Need to Know

Body:

We're seeing increased reports of online risks affecting children - including grooming, sextortion, and image-based abuse. Please talk to your child about who they interact with online, what they share, and how they can report uncomfortable situations.

2. Alert About a Dangerous App

Subject: Immediate Attention - Dangerous App Alert
